## PROVIDING HOPE IN THE FACE OF CRISIS

Economic crisis, financial crisis, credit crisis; however you phrase it the doom and gloom associated with the current monetary climate is not good news. For many of the people HopeStreet walks alongside this is nothing new.

The Australian Institute of Health & Welfare<sup>1</sup> recently reported that two-thirds of public housing tenants were unemployed between March and April last year, with just 7 percent of tenants in full-time work. The report also found indigenous people and single parents were also over-represented among the nations 330,000 government supported households.

HopeStreet is present in the public

housing estates precisely because this is where most of the disadvantage and poverty occurs in Australian urban communities. For many within these housing estates finances were already extremely limited even before the economic slowdown.

This raises the question about what hope we can provide as finances are squeezed even further. Of course there is our benevolence cupboard and Op Shop which provide a welcome stop-gap for those that are really struggling to last until the next support payment. Longer-term HopeStreet provides employment training for those who are looking to move back into the job market. Short-courses on budgeting and managing finances are also appreciated by

those who are trying to make the little they have stretch that much further.

All these initiatives provide hope in the face of crisis. However, beyond these hope is shared by being an ongoing presence in the community; by being available to listen to the various struggles, and to journey with people through the up's and down's. At the end of the day people draw immense hope by knowing they are not alone in the face of crisis. Thank you for allowing HopeStreet to be your hands and feet to some of Sydney's most disadvantaged and marginalised people.

## CONTINUING THE VISION OF RAWSON HOUSE

It has been important for us at HopeStreet to live amongst the people that we seek to serve whenever we can. In the inner city we face the challenge that outside public housing, real estate prices are very high. So we were thrilled when John and Dianna Rawson offered us their property in Bourke Street at cost.

Over the last five years, a series of "tentmakers" have supported themselves whilst getting involved in ministries at HopeStreet. Over the years, tentmakers have provided vital leadership to our churches in Woolloomooloo, Darlinghurst and in Glebe. They have reached out to people in the community through the employment training program, through support groups for people who are HIV+ and for ESL students, and through the Terrace.

The house has been a hub for heaps of community connections, lots of

BBQ's and yummy dinners, where people who are often left out have felt very welcome.

This year residents of the house have been part of the 2010 Church Plant (now called Imagine) through providing promotional skills, art exhibitions, music and connecting with residents at the Terrace.

The time has come when the Rawsons need to sell their property, so to continue this important part of our ministry we need someone sympathetic to buy it. We are trusting that there is a supporter or supporters who would be interested in buying the property and leasing it to HopeStreet for similar purposes under similar terms. We have already had some interest in forming a syndicate to do this. # URBAN EDUCATION AT HOPESTREET

Education is a vital part of our work and mission at HopeStreet. We believe that is vital to help people understand the issues of the inner city as they seek to get involved. We believe it's vital that we get to know people, not just facts, so our programs allow time to share stories and listen to others. Consistently we see schools, youth groups, church groups and ministry students changed by the experience of seeing what God is doing in the inner city first hand.

## Here are six ways you can get to understand the city better:

- 1. Urban Orientation** – walking tours of the inner city that are free and occur on the third Sunday of each month;
- 2. Xpose Tours** - Xpose is a 24 hour long experience of homelessness. You'll eat and sleep on the streets as well as learning about the forces that push people to the margins in the city through walking tours, simulation games, and analysis of current data;
- 3. High School Program** - HopeStreet offers a series

of provocative and inspiring presentations and guided walking tours designed specifically for high school students.

'Homelessness' unpacks an issue which affects 100,000 Australians through multimedia, simulation games and guided discussions. Homelessness and youth is given special focus.

'Life on the Edge' presents the forces of problem gambling, drugs and alcohol, sex work, runaway gentrification and mental illness with candour and compassion, and challenges us to contemplate what we value, individually and as a society;

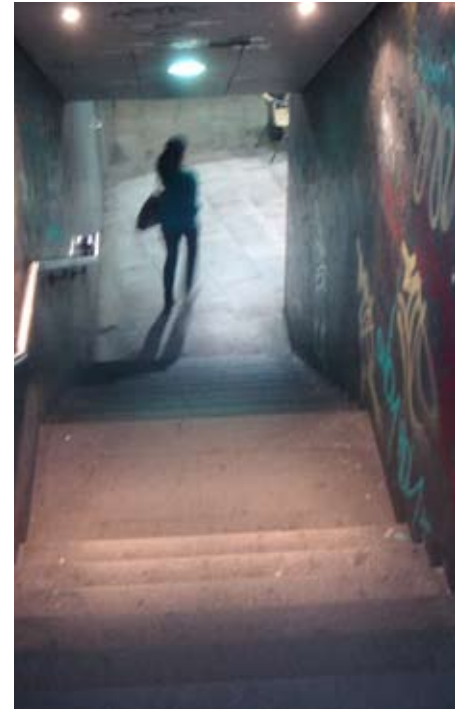
**4. Urban Internship** - become an intern at HopeStreet and receive training, experience and mentoring from the team. Internships run for 6 or 12 months, and a scholarship is available for one person each year;

**5. Residential Community** - move in to our residential community, Rawson House, and make justice, compassion and hope a way of life; and

**6. Ngage Intensive** – a week long

learning experience that tackles the various aspects of Urban Ministry (April 2009).
